Dr. Jalomo would like to add a sentence at the end of the first paragraph: Please be respectful in all communications during the Student Affairs Council meeting. The council discussed a lack of decorum and respect that was viewed, read, and experienced at the Student Success Conference. He stated the zoom etiquette guidelines will assist in respectful discussion and interaction in the meetings. Mr. McGriff suggested adding the new sentence to the first part of the paragraph. ## INFORMATION/DISCUSSION/PRESENTATIONS

- 1. Spring 2021 Study Areas & Black History Month Activities Augustine Nevarez Mr. Nevarez shared the Black History Month celebratory activities. The fliers are located on the council website for review. This is the second week of the study areas. The space was reconfigured based on feedback from students. The number of students allowed in the space was reduced. There are 25 desks spaced out with Plexiglass. The same precautions and regulations are being implemented that were used in the fall semester. Mr. Nevarez is grateful to the staff who volunteer. The area is available from 12-4pm, fully staffed. About 12 students sign up on average. The link to the event bright sign up is on the website as well as sent through the General information Canvas shell, social media, and email. An email was also sent out to faculty so they may share the information with their students. This quiet space is to assist students with internet and study challenges.
- 2. Umoja Update

Victoria Coleman/ Tony Anderson/ Laurencia Walker/ Bronwyn Moreno

Ms. Coleman is the Umoja Coordinator with the program. She shared a presentation with the council that is also located on the council website. In collaboration with the Office of Student Life they have hosted several Black History Month activities for the month of February. She informed the council that for the spring 2021 the goals are student contacts, developing a community of African American students, analyzing student lists, professional development, development of the advisory team of key stakeholders, Salinas Valley Promise cohort development, and an Umoja sponsored Black graduation. The goals of the program are: retention, support, academic success, and leadership development. Plans for the 2021-22 year are to secure a designated office space and student village, monthly porch talks, culturally responsive counseling, contributing to an anti-racist campus, and others. Dr. Jalomo suggested purchasing stoles for the Black graduation. Dr. Jalomo informed the council that Dean Johnson has completed an Umoja Program, Planning, and Assessment (PPA) report for the past three years. He advised Ms. Coleman to review the previous PPA s in order to plan

this year s PPA and request the funding and space mentioned in her presentation.
