Activities and Priorities in Support of Strategic Plan Goals

1. Completion of Degrees and Certificates

The Salinas Valley Promise application closes on April 10, 2023. Presently, more than 2000 students have applied as of April 6, 2023.

Salinas Valley Promise hosted a series of workshops for first and second year scholars including financial literacy, a collaboration with the Blue Zones Project, and career-themed industry panels. To date, over 700 scholars have participated in workshops.

DSPS Director participated in the DSPS Directors Region B meeting, as well as the statewide meeting focusing on management, budget, and staffing needs.

DSPS Director was invited to participate in the San Benito/Monterey County Local Partnership Agreement (LPA) meeting, as well as the Workforce Investment Opportunity Act (WIOA) mee,

DSPS welcomed graduating students with disabilities from North Monterey High School and El Puente School in their campus visit, and DSPS invited our Pathways Team to provide a campus tour. The Office of College Readiness, along with the Counseling department, hosted the Spring 2023 High School Counselor Breakfast on March 24, 2023. Over 50 high school counselors from throughout the Hartnell service area heard updates from student services and support programs.

The EOPS/CARE and CalWORKs office hosted a priority registration event on Friday, April 21, 2023, to encourage registration on priority day 1 and assist with registration. In preparation for the event, EOPS/CARE and CalWORKs counselors offered drop-in services for students needing assistance. The Office of Basic Needs, in collaboration with the Food Bank for Monterey County, provided food and fresh produce to over 450+ Hartnell College students and community members ranging from our satellite campuses in King and Soledad, to our main campus in Salinas; the food was distributed through our bi-weekly "Pop-up Food Pantries and Fresh Produce Truck distribution."

The Basic Needs Office funded Mental Health First Aid trainings for Hartnell College Staff and faculty that focused on safely and responsibly identifying and addressing potential mental illnesses and/or substance use disorders.

43 HEP students have completed their High School Equivalency certificate as of April 11, 2023.

2. Time and Units to Degree Completion

The Office of College Readiness collaborated with the CSUMB Gear Up Program to present to 8th graders and their parents from Washington Middle School on April 11, 2023. Attendees received a bilingual presentation about options to receive college credit while in high school.
