CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

Controlled substances are those defined in Education Code Sections 87011 and 88022. The following is a sample list of controlled substances. This is by no means comprehensive, but provides primary categories defined as controlled substances and one or more examples of each.

- 1. **Opiates** including:
 - a. Benzethidine
 - b. Methadone
 - c. Propiram
- 2. Opium derivatives including:
 - a. Codeine
 - b. Heroin
 - c. Morphine

- 3. Hallucinogenic substances including:
 - a. Lysergic acid diethylamide
 - b. Mescaline
 - c. Peyote
 - d. Marijuana
- 4. Depressants including:
 - a. Methaqualone
 - b. Alcohol

- 5. Stimulants on the central nervous system, including isomers:
 - a. Cocaine
 - b. Methamphetamine or derivatives
- 6. Any narcotic not specifically prescribed by a physician.

DANGERS OF DRUGS & ALCOHOL

The dangers of abusing controlled substances to individuals include, but are not limited to, the following possible effects:

Increased susceptibility to illness.

Possibility of malnutrition.

Increased tolerance for psychological dependence.

Higher propensity to have accidents.

Involvement in crime.

Disturbed sleep patterns.
