

The College Planning Council (CPC) held a meeting on Wednesday, May 18, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. in E-112 and during the meeting, the following occurred:

Minutes – Approved the minutes of May 4, 2016.

Board Policies and Administrative Procedures – Approved the following board policies/administrative procedures: BP/AP 3225, Institutional Effectiveness BP/AP 3250, Institutional Planning BP/AP 7310, Nepotism

Request for Additional Space – Approved to forward to the superintendent/president the request for additional space for crisis counseling services. The request is an office space that will become available once the Office of Institutional Planning, Research, and Effectiveness Office move to its new location.

One-Time Expenditures for 2016-17 - Approved the superintendent/president's recommendations for one-time expenditures for 2016-17 and approved to adjust the expenditures in accordance with available funding for physical plant (deferred maintenance) and instructional equipment. The proposed, eligible expenditures were selected among program planning assessment resource allocation requests.

Feasibility of Facilities General Obligation Bond Measure

Dr. Lewallen provided an update on the feasibility of a facilities general obligation bond measure. The governing board continues to explore this possibility. The superintendent/president plans to hold college forums and plans to meet with community organizations to gather feedback/input. A projected project list and timeline has been developed. A decision to move forward would require a board-adopted resolution no later than mid-August to ensure a November 2016 election.
