

College Planning Council Highlights

The College Planning Council (CPC) held a meeting on Wednesday, September 20, 2017 at 3:00 p.m. in E-112 and during the meeting, the following occurred:

Minutes The Council approved the minutes from the September 6, 2017 meeting.

Approval of Guiding Principles for Strategic Planning The Council approved the guiding principles for Strategic Plan 2019-2024. The six principles include foundational elements, institutional strategies, research and data informed, ongoing communication, stakeholder engagement, and impact of collaboration.

Outcomes The Council received outcomes on student access and success. In comparison to academic year 2011-12, the outcomes for 2016-17 are:

90% increase in degrees/certificated awarded

57% increase in CSU transfers

83% increase in UC transfers

44% increase in local high school graduates attending Hartnell

Hourly earnings increased from \$14.49 to \$21.70 after completing studies/training

Full-time work status increased from 33.1% to 57.5% after completing studies/training

Also, the presentation included outcomes for CSin3, STEM Internships, and Nursing and Allied Health Programs. The presentation on the new Force Funding Plan were presented as well.

Expectations for Participation in College Governance The Council reviewed proposed language addressing expectations for participation in college governance. If approved, the language would be inserted into governance council handbooks. The next step is for council members to share with constituents, gather feedback, provide suggested language, if applicable, and bring back to the Council before considering approval.

Participatory Governance Workshop The workshop on participatory governance for faculty and administration is scheduled October 9, 2017, 2-4 p.m. in Steinbeck Hall.
