

Intent of the Adult Education Block Grant



To better meet the educational needs of California's adult learners through expansion and improvement of adult education services at the state and regional levels

To do so through 71 regional adult education consortia made up of community colleges, K-12 districts, county offices of education, and JPAs, and their community partners

AB104 Overview



Stabilization of current K-12 district adult education programs via MOE allocations (\$337M for 15-16) Expansion and alignment of adult education programs via consortium allocations (\$163M for 15-16)

AB104: Accountability & Assessment Infrastructure Additional \$25M for development of an aligned, statewide system for the collection, reporting, and sharing of student and program data





AB104 Program Areas



- Basic skills education, including HSE/HSD
- 2. ESL, citizenship, and workforce preparation for immigrants
- Preparation for entry/reentry into the workforce
- Preparation to assist elementary and secondary school children succeed academically in school
- 5. Educational programs for adults with disabilities
- 6. Short-term CTE with high employment potential
- 7. Pre-apprenticeship training

Includes:

County corrections programs for 18+ year olds Programs for older adults

AB104 Objectives



- 1. Identify and evaluate existing adult education services
- Identify gaps, barriers, and needs and address them
- Integrate existing programs and create seamless transitions into postsecondary education or the workforce
- Address the gaps identified
- Employ approaches proven to accelerate a student's progress toward his/her academic or career goals
- 6. Collaborate in the provision of ongoing professional development opportunities for faculty and other staff
- 7. Develop partnerships and leverage existing regional structures and resources

AB104 Performance Measures

LCFF reserved for students who are 19 years of age or older

Consortium Membership Requirements



New conditions of membership:

- Reporting of all funds available to that member for the purposes of education and workforce services for adults and the uses of those funds
- Representation by an official designated by the governing board of the member
- Participation in all decisions made by the consortium
- Expenditure of funds according to the Consortium and State-approved Regional Adult Education Plans (3-Year and Annual Plans)
- Accurate reporting of expenditures of AEBG funds

Consortium Deliverables



New AB104 consortium deliverables:

- Governance plan, including structure, membership, decision-making, and other rules and regulations
- Regional 3-year adult education plan
- Annual plan, including programming and assessment plans
- Annual budget
- Reports of other sources of AE funding
- Performance and expenditure reports
- Crosswalks for student assessment and placement
