1. Adjustments to funded FTES for 2014-15 Willard Lewallen Dr. Lewallen announced that the college received notice of an adjustment to the funded FTES for fiscal year 2014-15 by 100 FTES. Dr. Lewallen used two documents provided by California Community College Chancellor's Office to explain the funding adjustments: 1)2014-15 Advance Principal Apportionment, and 2) First Principal Apportionment 2014-15. The adjusted funded FTES is 7,057; the adjustment falls under the targeted FTES of 7,100. Dr. Lewallen stated that it is important for the college to stay above the funded FTES to ensure the college receives full funding.
