The recommendation will forward to the superintendent/president and Governing Board for consideration of approval.

INFORMATION/DISCUSSION/PRESENTATIONS

1. Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) Grant

Moises Almendariz, Director of Hispanic Serving Institutions Initiatives, presented on the HSI STEM Title III grant. His presentation focused on the purpose of the grant, common activities, annual award amounts, term, major goals, strategies, project activities, objectives, expected outcomes, and the HSI project implementation team members. Prior to the meeting, the Council received the proposed grant project abstract and budget narrative and Moises stated the documents provide detailed information about the project and budget and suggested the Council review the documents. 2. Statewide Results for Facilities Bond Measures

Dr. Lewallen shared the statewide results for K-14 facilities bond measures from the November 2016 election. Overall, the voters passed 166 facility bond measures of which 14 were community college districts. In addition, with the passage of Proposition 51, the California Public School Facility Bond Initiative, \$9 billion (\$2 billion for community colleges) will be available to fund improvement and construction of school facilities for K-12 schools and community colleges. The process is competitive and the college plans to apply for funds..
