The Student Transfer Achievement Reform Act (SB 1440, Padilla, 2010), amended by SB 440 (Padilla, 2013), requires that before the start of the 2615cademic yeac alifornia Community Colleges (CCC) must create Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT) in Transfer Model Curriculum (TMC) disciplines that were finalized prior to the commencement of the 2013-14 academic year.

Regardless of the SB 440 requirement, all colleges are still required to create ADTs in every major and area of emphasis offered by that college for March approved after the 201314 academic year (California Education Code Section 66746(b)(1)(CP) lease note that CCCs have 18-months after the approved Template posted on the CCCCO website create these ADTs (highlighted in yellow on the attached ADT report)
